### 13. BUILDING PROJECTS ~ APPROVED AT JANUARY VOTER'S MEETING

In response to the Board of Trustee's proposals and estimate of costs, the Council recommended to the Voter's Assembly at the meeting on Jan. 27<sup>th</sup> to proceed with the following capital improvements in 2009. The Voters M/S/P the proposals.

- After years of roof leak problems and current leak problems developing, the Voters moved to go ahead with plans this spring to construct a new sloped roof over the existing flat roof (fellowship hall) and also a new roof over the sanctuary at an estimated cost of \$110,000.00. The cost includes tresses, steel roofing, mechanical and electrical, stucco exterior finishing on both endcaps facing 7<sup>th</sup> South and Kinderhaus II. Special attention and detail is to be maintained so that all work being done will be aesthetically pleasing and will blend appropriately with existing architecture.
- Complete the replacement of all exterior doors. This project is estimated to cost \$18,700.00. In addition to the basic door replacement, crosses are proposed to be etched into the front entrance canopy doors and stained glass is proposed to be installed on the side panels of the front canopy doors. Also money has been budgeted to replace all existing windows in the narthex and bell tower area with energy efficient glass.
- Remodel the kitchen at a total estimated cost of \$45,000.00. The proposed improvements include rearranging and eliminating portions of the existing cabinetry, installation of a new dishwasher, new appliances, replace the flooring, misc. plumbing, electrical and mechanical upgrades.

**Please note members of Redeemer much of these funds will be derived from the Ruth Bleick Fund. We give thanks that she so generously remembered her Church in her Will. But the projects, especially of the doors, windows and kitchen remodel make for wonderful special gifts ideas by congregational members who through stewardship, memorial gifts or designated donations would like to help see these projects get accomplished and would like to contribute towards them. Talk to the Trustees, Pastor or a Council Member if you have questions in regards to these projects.**

**We look forward to these projects getting underway as we update our 40 year old building with some new items. May all we do be a blessing to the proclamation of the Gospel.**
