ST PETER REGIONAL TREATMENT CENTER CHRISTMAS CHEER

Volunteers at the St Peter Regional Treatment Center work to provide a little bit of Christmas for mentally ill individuals state wide. The closing of the Fergus Falls, Brainerd, Willmar and Ah Gwah Ching Hospitals makes our job an ever bigger one.

Please keep our patients in your thoughts as you plan your Christmas gifting. We need your help.

It is when a person is ill that they are most in need of comfort and a gift would give them reassurance that they have not been forgotten. Many of the patients at our facility do not have family or friends with whom to share the holidays. Receiving a gift from you will matter greatly to someone who may otherwise be forgotten. 100% of the gifts and monies donated to this project do directly to the patients. Your gift would help to ensure a warm and beautiful holiday for the people receiving treatment from SPRTC, both in the hospital and the community based facilities.

Last year 70% of the patients in our program for the chronically mentally ill had no contact with family over the holidays. A patient upon receiving a new pair of shoes was asked, "I bet you didn't think you would get a pair of new shoes". "Yeah" he responded, "shoes that have never been worn by anybody else!" We forget that a \$10 pair of shoes can be so very important. A gift no matter how large or small does make a difference. Cash is also greatly appreciated. Pg. 58 Turkey Supreme- Instead of 6 cups of celery it should be 6 cups of turkey and 1 1/2 - 2 cups celery

Pg. 109 Macaroon Cupcakes- Her recipe does not call for coconut that is the way that she makes this recipe

Pg. 5 Salmon Dip- Add to ingredients 1 can of salmon

Pg. 92 Soft Sandwich Buns- It is 1 1/2 tsp active dry yeast not a cup

Pg. 30 Bean Soup- Use Navy or Pea Beans and Ham not a Ham bone

Pg. 49 Sunday Brunch Casserole- Bake at 425 for 10 minutes

Pg. 67 Hungarian Goulash- Use 2 lbs cubed beef (chuck or round steak) and it is 4T fat or oil not salt

Pg. 74 Sloppy Joes- Add 3/4 c hot water to the recipe. Put the flour and the water in with the beef mixture

Pg. 88 Bran Muffins- Add 2 1/2 c of flour to the recipe and change 1 tsp salt to 1 tsp baking soda

Pg. 94 and 100 Quick Carrot and Cream Cheese Bars. The recipe on pg 94 is incorrect the correct recipe is on pg 100

Pg. 124 Robert Redford Dessert- Add to recipe a Hershey Bar and in directions add shave Hershey Bar over Cool Whip

Pg. 133 Can't Fail Caramels- Add to directions... Pour into 8x8 buttered pan and cool. Cut into 1" squares

Pg. 135 Cream Caramels- Use a 8x8 pan for recipe
