Mission Sunday—October 26th Special Speaker: Rev. Dr. Armand Boehme

This coming month, for Reformation Sunday, we will have with us a special guest who will preach the Sunday sermon and lead in our large fellowship hall a presentation on his missionary tour of duty (nearly 2 years in Kazakhstan) helping establish Lutheranism by teaching future pastors that will serve the developing congregations.

The LCMS world missions began work in Kazakhstan in 1993. Remember this area of the world was controlled by the former USSR, therefore; evolutionistic atheism along with currents of Islam pull at the direction of the Kazakhstan people. The Lutheran body in Kazakhstan is called the Evangelical Lutheran Center (ELC). It now has six congregations and operates the People of God Evangelical Lutheran Seminary training men to be pastors and deacons.

Rev. Armand Boehme has served the Lord and the LCMS as a volunteer theological educator at the People of God Evangelical Lutheran Seminary in Almaty, Kazakhstan. Through the use of a translator, he taught classes on dogmatics, Isaiah, and an Old Testament overview. Armand was pastor at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Waseca, Minn., before the congregation granted him a year's sabbatical to serve in this mission field opportunity.

Born in Litchfield, Ill., Armand graduated from Blackburn College in Carlinville, Ill. He then went on to attend Concordia Theological Seminary in Springfield, Ill., and graduated in 1974. He enjoys auto racing, as well as reading and writing. His wife, Judy, taught English and Social Studies at Waseca High School and traveled with Armand visiting relatives who also serve in the Eurasian mission field.
